



HORIZON HIGH SCHOOL FAQ's – For non- MMSD Students

What kind of school is Horizon High School?

Horizon is a private recovery high school founded in 2005 for students age 14-18. Horizon provides a safe, educational and therapeutic environment for students in recovery who are committed to being clean and sober.

What are the requirements to be admitted to Horizon?

Students **MUST** be 30 days sober and **WANT** to attend Horizon High School. Students must pay a \$100 application fee and go through an admissions interview. Students typically shadow for a few days before officially enrolling.

What types of classes/academics are taught at Horizon?

Horizon provides a rigorous academic environment that students like attending. It integrates traditional learning, life skills education, and physical wellness. Students learn both in traditional classrooms in core subjects and are also challenged outside of the classroom with hands-on experiences. There is a focus on critical thinking and learning is tailored to each student. The staff members at Horizon are certified administrators, teachers and counselors who are skilled at handling substance abuse disorders.

How does Horizon help me in my recovery?

Random weekly drug tests are conducted and all students participate daily group counseling. Parent/family support is also available with our certified AODA counselor. The small environment allows the HHS staff to work with each student to support them in their recovery and education. Each student develops an individualized recovery and relapse prevention plan upon admission.

How long do students attend Horizon High School?

Horizon is a 4-year high school, so students may enroll at any point in their high school career and attend until they graduate. Students may apply for admission at any time during the year.

How much does it cost to attend Horizon High School?

Students must pay the \$100 application fee to attend Horizon High School. Tuition is \$6000 per semester and is pro-rated based on when a student enrolls. Some area school districts have historically provided tuition assistance to students wishing to transfer to Horizon. HHS staff will work with you to assist you in obtaining tuition assistance. Need-based financial aid is also available and can be applied for upon admission.
